

**Friendship Diversion Services** provides an effective, tax-saving community alternative. All referrals are from the County Prosecutor for felony or misdemeanor cases. Defendants complete their program and remain in the community as taxpaying, viable members, which represent an extremely important, less expensive, alternative to incarceration.

Friendship's purpose is to monitor and assist defendants by directing them toward self-motivation, skill enhancement (social and employment), and accountability. Defendants will be encouraged to participate in treatment programs, counseling, gain employment and to pursue academic opportunities.

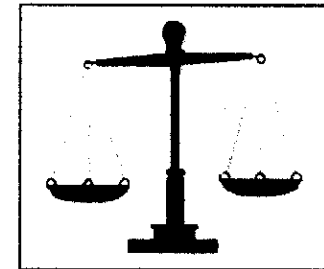

## PRE-TRIAL DIVERSION

Provides an alternative to sentencing, jail, or probation for Court defendants, who are referred by the County Prosecutor's office. All defendants have the right to consult with their attorney prior to signing the diversion agreement.

Friendship has been in existence in Thurston County since 1974. Branch offices of Friendship are staffed in Olympia, Mason, Spokane, Grant, Okanogan, Clallam and Jefferson counties. Diversion is not a "right," it is an opportunity for defendants to admit guilt and accept responsibility, by paying restitution to their victim, fines assessed by the court, the fee assessed by Friendship, performing community service hours and complying with treatment requirements if mandated.

Friendship staff completes an intake interview with the defendant, fully explaining the expectations of the diversion, the consequences for failure to comply and the incentives for completion.

The Program expectations are reviewed by a staff member with the defendant, and a contract is prepared outlining those requirements. Once the defendant signs this contract they make a commitment to comply with the conditions set forth.

Staff will provide case management and they are conversant with many resources within the community and will work with the defendant to resolve problems, by referring to employment services, training or education opportunities and generally, make use of resources which may be unknown to the defendant.

Standard Contract Conditions also include:

- Report to case manager as instructed.
- Comply with law-abiding behavior
- No use of or possession of controlled substances
- Notification within 24 hours of any changes in employment, marital status, address, or telephone.

## DAY REPORTING

Courts have the option of ordering day reporting as a condition of release. Defendants ordered to "Day Reporting" must report in person to our office.

Staff conduct an intake interview, and establish a daily reporting schedule with each defendant. They may be ordered to report daily, or several times per week depending on the Court's Order. Requirements of the daily schedule incorporate any treatment directed by the court.

Additional services to day reporters include referrals to service agencies, employment skills, further education needs and directives for drug/alcohol services when appropriate. Charge \$3.50 per day with a \$25.00 set up fee.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE SUPERVISION

Friendship staff meets with defendants who are given a list of non-profit community agencies throughout Jefferson County as well as a timesheet for recording their hours worked. Defendants are then scheduled to return to our office to turn in hours worked by turning in timesheets with the agency name, a supervisor's signature and contact information. Friendship staff contacts the supervisor and verifies the hours worked before writing confirmation reports to the court. Supervision fees are a flat rate based on the amount of community service hours assigned.

## ELECTRONIC HOME/ALCOHOL MONITORING

Friendship staff completes an intake interview with the defendant, fully explaining the expectations of the while serving their sentence as well as the consequences for failure to comply.

### **GPS (Global Positioning System)**

SecureAlert's TrackerPal II: Monitors participants through a GPS tracking device using satellite, cellular and voice communication and does not require a landline connection. Daily cost is \$17.50.

### **VICAP (Video Capture)**

G4S VICAP: Monitors participants BAC (Blood Alcohol Content) with random breath tests conducted with a video capture device connected through the participant's **basic** landline home phone. Participants are videotaped while performing tests and results are recorded. Daily cost is \$10.00 (\$7.50 per day if used in conjunction with GPS monitoring)

## **SCRAMx (Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitoring with House Arrest option)**

AMS' SCRAMx: Monitors through 24/7 continuous testing of a participant's TAC (Transdermal Alcohol Content) with readings captured every 30 minutes. Readings can be uploaded through a participant's **basic** landline home phone or through regular appointments to our office. Daily cost is \$15.00. (\$25.00 if used with House Arrest option)

**FEE's:** All participants will pay a setup fee of \$25.00 (\$50.00 for out of County orders) and are required to pay daily fees one week in advance at the time of hookup and each week thereafter.

**Any participant ordered to Electronic Home/Alcohol Monitoring with our agency are required to remain drug and alcohol free while being monitored and are subject to random urinalyses at their expense.**
