The loss or removal of slope vegetation can result in either increased rates of erosion or higher frequencies of slope failure. Vegetation, primarily woody plants, help to prevent mass-movement by providing proven root reinforcement and soil moisture modification. Since tree removal will have a negative impact on long term bluff stability, it is recommended to keep at least 75% of the required buffer in woody vegetation, allowing for 25% in view corridors.
