I have suggestions on improving the designations for Reaches A, E, L, CC, EE, II, and III.

Here is the first comment on Reach A.

The photos are from the DOE Coastal Atlas and are in Reach order, that is, starting in Brinnon and running along the coast to Gardiner. On the page the photos are read left to right, top to bottom. Not all photos are included.

Sometimes I refer to the percent shoreline modification. This also comes from the DOE Coastal Atlas, obtained by turning on the Shoreline Modification layer. I will bring a hard copy of that map to the meeting.

SED Criteria

1. Natural:
 - a. Significant natural feature such as steep slope, delta, or feeder bluff ,or,
 - b. Almost completely un-built, and,
 - c. Not close to a road, and,
 - d. Of viable size

2. Conservancy
 - a. Mostly un-built, and,
 - b. Not close to a road

3. Residential
 - a. At least ½ built out

4. High Intensity
 - a. Mostly built out, or,
 - b. ½ built out, and,
 - c. industry or commerce present

Reach Comments

- A The entire reach is closely bordered by Hwy 101.
 The southernmost ¼ mile should be conservancy.
 The next ¾ mile should be residential. DOE shows it as 71-100 percent improved shoreline.
 Fulton Creek should be natural but including only 150 feet on either side along the shoreline.
