

Add to Page 2- 15, after number 7:

8. "Fire hazard" means the accumulation of combustible materials in such a condition as to be readily ignited and in such a quantity as to create a hazard from fire to nearby structures, life and property.

Renumber the following entries as "9." And on.

Add to Page 6-15, after number 6.A.5:

6. Fire hazards to structures due to naturally fallen dead limbs and branches in a shoreline buffer may be reduced by chipping if the chipped material is returned to the original location. Fallen tree trunks may not be removed or chipped.
