

CAN YOU “ADOPT-A-WEED-PATCH”?

Weeds in Jefferson County continue to flourish while budget cuts have reduced staff hours. The Jefferson County Noxious Weed Control Board is appealing to the community to help by joining an “Adopt-A-Weed-Patch” program.

Can you get together with your friends and neighbors and commit to pulling weeds on a patch near your home (or school, church or where you work) a few times each year?

Pulling noxious weeds is a way you can enhance wildlife habitat, reduce danger of poisoning to people and livestock, have fun, and get some healthy outdoor exercise, all at the same time!

The Weed Board will help groups to organize, identify areas they can work on, loan gloves and tools, help with plant identification and participate in weed pulls as available. We also help to coordinate with landowners and make sure that groups have the necessary permits and waivers in place.
