

Wildfire Preparedness

Changes in weather and/or fire conditions could create a threatening situation requiring residents to evacuate.

Take the time now to become prepared.

Pack clothes, medications, important documents to include your homeowner's insurance policy, property deed, military records, birth certificates, medical records, etc.

Remember your pets. Plan ahead for any livestock you have. Your small pets should be in a carrying case. If you have livestock but can't evacuate them, turn them loose.

Keep your vehicle gas tank at least half full.

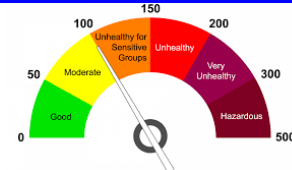

WHERE TO GO

Residents will be directed to areas away from fire danger. An exact location will depend on the area where the fire is and availability of facilities and sheltering options. When evacuating, be prepared to be fast and flexible, and await further direction.

EVACUATION LEVELS

LEVEL 1 – GET READY: Residents should be aware that danger exists & monitor local media for information. Prepare for evacuation if conditions worsen.

LEVEL 2 – GET SET: A significant danger is expected. Residents should voluntarily evacuate or be ready to leave on short notice.

LEVEL 3 – GO!!!: Conditions present a specific & immediate threat to life and safety. Residents receiving a Level 3 evacuation notice should evacuate immediately.
