Project Description: Purchase and show the Movie <i>Where's Molly?</i> on October 17 th 2015, which is National Disability Employment Month at the local Rose Theatre and to provide 18 copies of this film and 12 copies of a book called <i>Jesse, A Mother's Story</i> .			
Benefits:	<p><i>Where's Molly</i> is a question that Jeff Daly, (Molly's brother) has been asking since he was 6 years old, when his sister Molly, (almost 3 yrs. old) silently disappeared never to come home again. While his parents refused to talk about Molly, Jeff was left to wonder and to mourn the sudden and demystifying loss of his only sister. Now, 47 years later, Jeff finally discovered the family secret that kept him from his sister.</p> <p>We had hoped to have Jeff Daly & his wife Cindy, the producers of the film, brother & sister-in-law of Molly attend the showing, but Jeff is dealing with medical issues and will not be able to attend. Instead we would like use some funding to purchase 18 copies of this film and 12 copies of a book called <i>Jesse, A Mother's Story</i>, a memoir by Marianne Leonie Cooper. We plan to have copies of the film, <i>Jesse, A Mother's Story</i> and signed copies of Lee Springgate's memoir called <i>Angels Among Us</i>, available before/after the film available for suggested donations. Both books speak to a families experience with a son with significant developmental disabilities; the challenges and wonders of raising a child in the community. The books reflect the dichotomy of community life vs. the institutional life depicted in the film. All proceeds will be donated to Special Olympics.</p> <p>The focus of the Accessible Communities Advisory Committee is to fund projects that will continue to raise awareness and acceptance of people with disabilities in Jefferson County, with a focus on education, access and barrier removal.</p>
